

SMILING FACES

Some young Romanians have something to smile about, thanks to the work of Nicole Everts, an October, 2008 work team member. A dental hygienist from Colorado, Nicole ran across our website while searching the Internet for an opportunity to do charitable dental work. After talking with Geanie Burns and reviewing the application packet, Nicole decided to join the team. She realized her goal when Mariana Achiriloaie, Board Member, arranged for her to work as a hygienist in the office of a Brasov dentist. The lucky recipients of Nicole's work were 9 young men in a residential transitional program — One Step to the Future — an organization for which Hearts has been a supporter since last year. Many of Nicole's patients had little, if any previous dental care. For some, it was their first time to sit in a dental chair. Most of the young men need additional work, including extractions, root canals, crowns and fillings. Nicole made a financial contribution to Hearts Across Romania to help continue this project with follow-up dental care for these young men, and our organization will partner in this effort.

HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

And our hearts were with young Romanian men needing a place to call home. Hearts Across Romania continued their work with "One Step to the Future", a full-service transitional program providing, among other things, housing for young men after they leave the orphanages. Hearts first began working with Florin Catanescu, director of the program, in May, 2007 when the work team renovated and furnished an additional room for 3 more residents. We expanded our work with Florin on the October, 2008 trip to include the remodeling of two more rooms.

Hearts purchased paint and supplies, carpet, drapes, bedding, lamps, pictures, and new windows and doors for the rooms, and our volunteer team worked alongside the young men who will be soon be moving in in order to complete the job. Geanie Burns and Susan Flanagan, Board Members, took on the task of grilling sandwiches for the working boys, while Kathy Roote, volunteer, swept and cleaned, so it was indeed a team effort.

Hearts would like to thank team members Jerry Williams, Leigh Ann Dibble, Robert Davis, and Nicole Everts for their generosity in purchasing desks, chairs, clothing cabinets and accessories to complete furnishing the rooms and to create more of a feeling of "home".

Looking around at the smiling faces of the young men who have a nice place to call home was a great way to end our trip.

Our first priority after arriving in Brasov was driving to Dacia, a small village about an hour away, to visit the children in the orphanage there. With new tennis shoes donated by Buckner's Shoes for Orphans Souls program in Dallas, we fitted the 32 children with new footwear — how delighted they were and how grateful Hearts is for the donation of shoes and slippers. Special thanks to Susan Flanagan and her volunteers, Carolyn Betti and her six-year old daughters from Houston, for picking up the shoes.

Later in the week, Hearts' team returned to Dacia, where we had a picnic for the children. We walked down the road from the orphanage to a beautiful area with green meadows and

hillsides, a perfect spot for a cookout. Hearts provided chicken, sausage, coleslaw, cookies and drinks, while Monica, a wonderful cook at the orphanage, worked over an open fire to prepare the meal.

Leigh Ann and Nicole provided plenty of toys for the kids to play with and, of course, they had lots of attention from the adults. And did we mention walking up and down the steep hills with the children? Among the eight of us from the U.S., Mariana set the record for exercise with the kids.
